## **Types of Homework**

### **Formative Assessment**

Involves teachers

- Sharing learning intentions/success criteria with pupils to help them recognise the standards to aim for
- Providing pupils with regular feedback in class on their strengths and how to improve
- Using marking and feedback that help pupils to understand how to improve

#### Involves pupils

- Using peer and self assessment learning to make their own improvements and increasingly becoming independent learners
- Developing ideas and skills and to improve in the light of their experiences

#### **Summative Assessment**

Involves teachers

- Marking homework and giving a score or grade in accordance with SQA criteria
- Giving constructive advice on how to improve may be given in addition to the mark

Staff are available at lunchtime/after school (by arrangement) if any pupil wishes to complete homework or ask questions related to homework

In the event of prolonged school closure due to bad weather or pupil absence, staff would make available homework, revision materials on *Glow*.
